DETAILS OF THE SCHEME ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Nominations are invited in the following categories:-
 - A. **New building** - this can include any individual building, or a group of buildings on a single site.
 - B. **Extension to an existing building.**
 - C. **Conservation** - repair, restoration or conversion of an existing building.
 - D. **Landscape Design** - a planting/hard landscape scheme either in association with a new development or a stand alone project e.g. enhancement of a public open space, play area etc.
2. Entries in categories A, B and C must have been completed on site since January 2005. Entries in category D must have been completed **before** January 2006. All permissions for the development must have been obtained and all conditions attached to such permissions must have been complied with. Development within the Broads Authority area will not be eligible.
3. Entries may be submitted by owners, clients, architects, landscape architects, designers, contractors, manufacturers, parish councils, amenity societies or any member of the public.
4. There is no limit to the number of entries which may be submitted from any one source, but in all cases the consent of the owner must be obtained prior to making the nomination.
5. Entries **must be** accompanied by a completed entry form and supported by photographs and/or drawings preferably showing the site before and after completion as appropriate.
6. The closing date for receipt of entries is Friday 31 August 2007 and the awards will be made on 16 November 2007.
7. Entries will be judged by an assessment panel comprising Councillors and Officers and an external assessor nominated by the Norfolk Association of Architects on behalf of the Royal Institute of British Architects. Their decision will be final.
8. If no nominations are considered by the panel to be of the required standard of excellence in their design, no award will be made.
