I write to support the proposed change to this boundary. The properties affected are all much closer to the centre of Denton than to the centre of Earsham village. The current western boundary of Earsham parish lies a long way west of the village and includes land and properties that would be more sensibly included in the parish of Denton. Most importantly the residents affected all feel part of the Denton community and are deeply involved with Denton organisations including its Parish Council and its social clubs. They have little association with Earsham. The boundary is well defined by concrete private roads, a major drainage channel and significant field boundaries. Importantly, Earsham Parish Council is not objecting to the change and was largely unaware that the land and properties affected are part of their parish.
