



The Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information (England) Regulations 2012

Notice of Private Meeting

Regulation 5 of the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) Meetings and Access to Information (England) Regulations 2012 requires 28 clear days notice to be published of the intention to hold a meeting of a decision-making body in private.

Regulation 5 (6) allows, that with the agreement of the Chairman of the relevant Scrutiny Committee, a meeting may be held in private where publication in accordance with Regulation 5 is impracticable.

The Chairman of the Scrutiny Committee has agreed that the following item can be considered in private session at the Cabinet meeting on 19 March 2018:

- **Ketts Park Redevelopment Project**

This report will be exempt on the grounds that it contains commercially sensitive information (by virtue of paragraph 3 of Part 1 of Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act 1972).

This report cannot wait until the next meeting of the Cabinet on 30 April, because the deadline for some of the external funding secured, will have expired.

Notice is therefore hereby given under Regulation 5(7) to hold part of a meeting of the Cabinet on Monday 19 March 2018 in private, to consider the report entitled Ketts Park Redevelopment Project
